


- 1. While helpful for global comparisons, national averages are not very informative when you want to fix things ...
- 2. Data on quality needed that inform the path to improvement
- 3. Need sub-national disaggregation that coincides with administrative boundaries for decision-making and accountability

Data to inform the path to improvement Quality and relevant disaggregation



Data for Subnational Disaggregation

- Data that coincides with administrative boundaries for decision-making
 - Allows a district/regional manager to set goals, plan, budget and track performance
 - Important for accountability and to acknowledge performance
- Costly: e.g. for Kenya: at least 2,000 facilities
 - Possible solution: Combining survey data and routine data using small area estimation techniques?
 - Use surveys for data uniquely suited for surveys such as quality of service delivery














Countyspecific data allows for interventions to be tailored to each county
